




Why Do We Do That? ANAMNISIS and OFFERING

"At one time we called the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist and before the eucharistic prayer the "offertory." Now we refer to this transition time as the presentation and preparation of the gifts. The reason for this change in terminology is the that the offering actually takes place during the eucharistic prayer, after the institution narrative (the recounting of the Last Supper that is part of every eucharistic prayer.) So, for example, in Eucharistic Prayer II we pray, "Therefore, as we celebrate / the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, / we offer you, Lord, / the Bread of Life and Chalice of salvation, / giving thanks that you held us worthy / to be in your presence and minister to you." Much is happening in this short prayer.

First, we *remember* Jesus' death and resurrection. In Greek, "remember" is the word *anamnesis*. This remembering, however, is not simply a recalling of a past historical event. Liturgical *anamnesis* is a wholly present act in which the meaning and import of what we are remembering is in the present, happening now. The self-offering of Jesus on the cross and his exaltation at the resurrection are, indeed, happening in this very liturgical celebration when Jesus ceaselessly gives himself over to his Father for our salvation.

Second, we are counted worthy to be in God's presence as ministers not because of any act of our own, but because we are one with the divine Son who is being *offered*. And if the Son is offered, so are we. Our ministry as assembly is to offer ourselves along with the risen Christ (see GIRM 79f.) And just as Christ's self-offering is unceasing, so must ours be. Our surrender to God's transforming action in the eucharistic prayer is our offering of ourselves at this moment during liturgy as a pledge of our self-offering and as a commitment to a Gospel way of living."


