Parish School of Religion (PSR) 2020-2021

During the week of July 27-31 we surveyed our current PSR families to gain an understanding of the comfort level and family preferences with returning to PSR in the fall. With multiple options for schooling in area school districts, it was decided that the best way to make a plan for moving forward would be to get feedback from those presently involved. Based on the results, we will be offering multiple options for religious education this year. Families will be asked to register based on the following options. Option 1 is the traditional in-person option. Option 2 is a virtual option with online assignments and coursework. Option 3 will follow a blended model, where students will complete most weeks virtually, but will gather in person as a family periodically for family-based lessons. Parent meetings/registration sessions will be scheduled throughout the month of August based on the option each family has chosen. Volunteers Needed for Religious Education

This year brings the opportunity for new involvement in our religious education programs! Also, if you have been reluctant to volunteer in the past, because you are unable to make a weekly commitment, there are ways for you to be involved on a monthly or bi-monthly basis. We are in need of volunteers in the following areas: grade-level catechesis (in-person); developing on-line lessons/resources; assisting with technological needs/providing support for catechists to get lessons and resources online; cleaning the school building following PSR sessions; facilitating pick-up and drop-off procedures/monitoring social distancing and safety during PSR sessions; acting as a substitute catechist when needed; and assisting with sacramental preparation as part of a team approach. Please note that compliance with the Child Protection Policy of the Diocese of Youngstown may be required based on the type of volunteering you wish to do. Dear Parishioners of St. Barbara and St. Mary's Parishes,

We wanted to give you an update on our Vacation Bible School program in 2020. Once again, thank you so much for your incredible generosity in donating supplies and funds to assist us in putting on the program. Following Governor DeWine's public address on Wednesday, July 15, we made the difficult decision to modify the format of our program from in-person to at-home. We put together kits for each student that included craft materials/supplies, at-home faith lesson pages, and their Vacation Bible School t-shirts. In addition, our wonderful volunteer catechists created Bible lesson videos for each night, and we were able to share links to the songs for students to learn from home. Students were able to hear the story of St. Patrick and his adventures by a different reader each night – Fr. Gretchko, Fr. Cline (and his dog, Autumn), Seminarian, Garrett Guerrieri, Michael Alesiano, and Amy Davis. In the fall when it is safe to gather again, we plan to hold a follow-up event for the children to come together for games, snacks, and to sing the songs! There were thirty-two participants.

With thanksgiving, we want to express our gratitude to all of the parishioners from both parishes who made generous donations of supplies, gift cards, water bottles, and cash. Thank you to those who volunteered their time in numerous ways – by making masks for the students (which we will use in the fall), by preparing and delivering lessons, by brainstorming ideas for how to make a safe and effective program, and by distributing supplies! 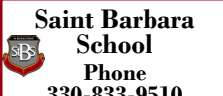
