A Note from Fr. Matthew

Lesson on ministry

In his book **My God and I**, theologian and minister Lewis Smedes writes about his years as pastor:



"I made more than my share of mistakes [as pastor] . . . mistakes which, if they were aware of them, the good people I worked for were quick to for-give. But there was one mistake I made early on that was all but unforgive-able. I forgot that the worshippers whom I was called to serve were ordinary people — not leaders, not educated, not wealthy, just working people — and would never be anything else. I wanted them to be leaders, vision-aries, educated, wealthy, and in my heart I faulted them for not fitting my notion of what I wanted them to be. Then I remembered what my former professor of church history told me the night I was ordained. Walking into the church with him, I asked him if he had one last piece of advice for me. "Yeah,' he said, 'just remember that the people of your church are ordinary people. If you take them as they are, you will do OK.'

"I did sometimes forget that I was called to serve *these* people, not the elite Christians I wish they were. When I did forget, I was ineffective, unloving, impatient, wretched. As time went by, however, and as I learned more about myself, I knew I was just as weak, just as limited, just as insecure, just as boring, just as frightened — and just as sinful — as they were When I finally got that fact firmly lodged in my soul, I became, I think a passable servant."

Often taking the "last place" is a matter of changing our attitude rather than our physical place, a question of generosity rather than status. God's banquet table includes places of honor for every hurting, confused soul — saint and sinner, scholar and laborer, billionaire and shift worker. The spirit of humility as taught by Jesus is the realization that we share with every human being the dignity of being made in the image and likeness of God; Christ-like humility is the ability to see one another as God sees us and to rejoice in being ministers to one another in the joys and struggles we all experience.


