

Dear Friends.

As we enter into this unofficial last weekend of summer before Labor Day Weekend already 2 weeks into a new school year and all the activities that begin this coming fall, we hear the poignant words of St. Paul, calling us to a renewed heart and mind. I often felt that September should be the first month of the year since everything starts in earnest. Our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate their high holy days Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, beginning a New Year.

Both Jeremiah and Jesus reflect on the consequences of following the will of God. Jeremiah is ridiculed and persecuted for calling God's people to repentance and to greater concern for the poor. Jesus tells the disciples what were the implications of the title the Christ that Peter gave him: suffering, rejection and death, leading to resurrection on the third day.

I have been thinking a lot about the need to change my attitude as I seek to discern the will of God. The rise in hate groups in our country which includes violent behavior have caused me to look at the racism in my own heart. Over the summer I have been reading the book "Racial Justice and the Catholic Church" written by Fr. Bryan Massingale. The first chapter alone has challenged me to see how racism is imbedded in the very culture we live in. I pray for the grace to be color blind.

We warmly welcome all of our students and teachers back and our principal, Mrs. Marisa Stoll who has been a part of the St Barbara family for several years. 


