The year in receipts

Luke 12: 32-48

She's a freelance writer, so she saves her receipts in a big envelope: receipts for the paper and toner for her printer, the books and magazines she buys for research, her traveling expenses to meetings and interviews. And every April she empties the envelope on her desk and sorts the slips into categories and lists her expenses and mileage. Through the piles of receipts, she re-constructs the past year of her life.

There will, of course, be a check written to Uncle Sam when's she done. But in the process of completing her tax return, she'll remember the people she met and worked with and learned from. She'll take satisfaction in the good work she did over the past 12 months. She'll laugh again at the funny and wondrous and enriching moments of the year completed. There will also be pangs of regret for her mistakes and fumbles, second-guessing some decisions she made, resolving to handle some issues — and personalities — differently next time (and there will definitely be a next time!). There are also the *thank you letters from the charities and nonprofits whose work she contributed to. Money well spent, she smiles.* 

No one likes to pay taxes. But there is a sense of accomplishment and gratitude in having the means and work to pay them.

A year in a life, chronicled in piles of receipts.

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers several short parables and images to emphasize the preciousness of the gift of time. In the busyness of our lives, in our everyday struggles to maintain some sense of control over our time, we often forget that time itself is a gift. God has breathed his life into us so that we might experience the love that compelled God to create us in the first place, and signs of that love are all around us — we're just too overwhelmed to appreciate them. This writer rediscovers those blessings in her life in the envelope stuffed with the receipts and records of the past tax year. It's an experience of Christ-like humility: the grace to realize and be grateful for the gifts we have received from God and the resolve to put our gifts to the service of our whole "household."
