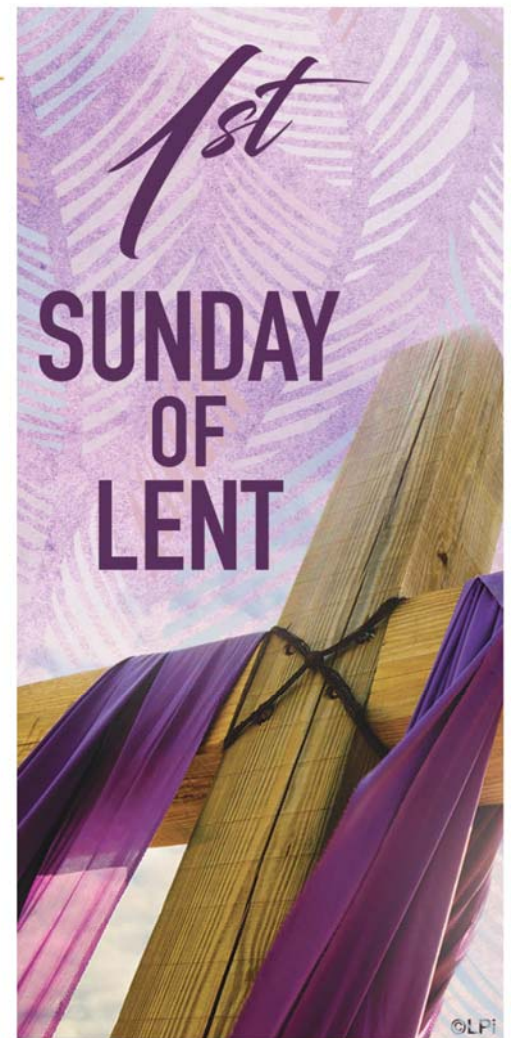

Dear Parishioners,

For years the beginning of the Lenten season has been also the launch of the Annual Bishop's Appeal. Our parish was given an Appeal goal of \$61,000 to contribute towards the diocesan goal of \$4 million. Bishop Bonnar is counting on our support of the 2021 Bishop's Appeal to reach our goal. In the guidelines for the Appeal, it stated that the contributions collected through this campaign are used the following way:
