#### A Note from Fr. Matthew

The good even among the most evil . . .



In his 27 tears as a Pulitzer Prize-winning foreign correspondent and columnist for **The** 

**New York Times**, Nicholas Kristof's travels have taken him to some of the most horrific wars and dangerous corners of the world. But in a recent column, Kristof writes that even in the most violent conflicts, "side by side with the worst of humanity, you find the best."

Kristof witnessed that firsthand in the genocide in Darfur in 2005.

"In Darfur, it was hard to keep from weeping as I interviewed shellshocked children who had been shot, raped or orphaned. No one could report in Darfur and not smell the evil in the air. Yet alongside the monsters, I invariably found heroes. "There were teenagers who volunteered to use their bows and arrows to protect their villages from militiamen with automatic weapons. There were aid workers, mostly local, who risked their lives to deliver assistance. And there were ordinary Sudanese like Suad Ahmed, a then-25-year-old Darfuri woman I met in one dusty refugee camp.

"Suad had been out collecting firewood with her 10-year-old sister, Halima, when they saw the *janjaweed*, *a genocidal militia*, *approaching on horseback*.

"Run!" Suad told her sister. 'You must run and escape.'

"Suad played down her heroism, telling me that even if she had fled, she might have been caught anyway. She said that her sister's escape made the sacrifice worth it.

"Even in a landscape of evil," Kristof writes. "the most memorable people aren't the Himmlers and Eichmanns but the Anne Franks and Raoul Wallenbergs — and Suad Ahmeds — capable of exhilarating goodness in the face of nauseating evil."

Our faith in the Gospel, Jesus enables us to see the Spirit of God in the most difficult and challenging times. The Spirit of God is "upon" us when we rise to challenge injustice and raise up God-inspired good in the midst of the darkest evil. God's Spirit opens our hearts to the possibilities for creating God's Kingdom in our midst: "glad tidings" for the poor, sight to the blind and light to the lost, justice for the oppressed, and a time of peace and fulfillment for all.

### DIOCESE OF YOUNGSTOWN

January 10, 2022

Dear Reverend Clergy, Religious, Seminarians, Staff and Faithful of the Diocese of Youngstown,

On January 22, 2022, the Church in the United States observes a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. In the Collect at Holy Mass for this special day we find these words, "God our Creator, we give thanks to you, who alone have the power to impart the breath of life as you form each of us in our mother's womb; grant we pray, that we whom you have made stewards of creation, may remain faithful to this sacred trust and constant in safeguarding the dignity of every human life."

Indeed, God alone engenders the gift of life. As a Church we steadfastly believe that this life begins in the mother's womb at conception and therefore is sacred. As Catholics it is incumbent for all of us to protect and defend this life and to pray daily for an end to abortion. There is no justifiable reason or cause for an abortion. And yet, every year, thousands of lives are aborted in our country. We cannot afford to be selective or dismissive about this sacred gift of life that comes from God.

I invite you to join me to pray for an end to abortion and a greater appreciation of life from conception to natural death. This year, I am celebrating two diocesan Masses for Life: on Tuesday, January 18, at 6:30pm in the Our Lady of Perpetual Help Chapel of Walsh University in North Canton, and on Sunday, January 23, at 4:00pm in Saint Columba Cathedral. If you are or were unable to attend these Masses, I ask that you designate a day to attend Mass to pray for life and an end to abortion.

As the Collect for the special Mass intimates, we also have a responsibility to safeguard and protect the dignity of every human life. In this time of pandemic, it is imperative that we all do our part to protect one another by becoming vaccinated. Consistent with previous teaching of the Church, Vatican authorities have examined the moral implications of the available vaccines and have determined that they are not only permissible to use, but also an act of moral responsibility. Pope Francis has stated that getting vaccinated is "an act of charity for the common good." Seeking the proper vaccinations is not a political statement but the responsible, Catholic, and just thing to do for the good of all. To those who remain unvaccinated, I beg you as your spiritual father to become vaccinated as soon as possible as an act of charity for the common good. As we sing in the old song, "They will know we are Christians by our love." We must never grow weary of loving one another and promoting life.

Be assured of a remembrance in my prayers, and please pray for me. Together, let us pray, for an end to abortion, a greater appreciation of life and of one another, and *"That all may be one."*
