

Mass during Eucharistic Adoration. The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us - all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The National Prayer Vigil for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington D.C. has had over 12,000 pilgrims attend the Opening Mass in years past. This year, due to the COVID-19 restrictions, they can only accommodate 100 persons total, including the celebrant and liturgical ministers. Therefore, attendance will be by invitation only. (Even bishops are being discouraged from attending in person.) However, the Mass, which starts at 8:30 p.m. this year, will be televised by EWTN. The Opening Mass will be followed by a series of Holy Hours throughout the night, in various locations.

The 8:00 a.m. Closing Mass on January 29th at the Basilica will also be televised by EWTN.




