On call

In his memoir **The Soul of Care**, physician and medical school professor Arthur Kleinman recounts the experience of a young medical student that shook her to the core.

The young doctor had always wanted to be physician, the kind of physician who cared about her patients and who valued above all else attending to their experiences of suffering. It was her first year of residency in internal medicine. Because of a scheduling mix-up, she was also on-call that evening after a busy day in the wards. A number of emergency admissions and clinical issues kept her up until 2 a.m. She went to get some sleep in the on-call room, but she was quickly called to treat several patients requiring her immediate attention.

First on her list was a middle-aged woman who was scheduled for a major surgical procedure later that morning. Her intravenous line had become blocked and the nurse had been unable to get the IV restarted or put in a new one. The intern started a new IV and went off to the next patient on her list. As she was leaving the room, the woman said to her in a shaky voice how frightened she was of the upcoming surgery and how much she needed to talk. The exhausted doctor found herself responding almost automatically, "I'm sorry! I can't stop right now to talk to you. I have other patients to see." With that, she ran down the hallway — but after twenty yards or so, she stopped. *How could I have just done that?* She asked herself. *I went into medicine precisely because I want to listen and to speak with patients like this. And here I am running away.*

She turned around and returned to the patient's bedside. She apologized for running off and spent the next half hour sitting on the bed, holding the patient's hand, and trying as best she could to answer her questions and ease her anxiety about her surgery later that morning.

The medical student and Dr. Kleinman later talked about what happened. Dr. Kleinman pointed out to her that most physicians facing the same issue "would have kept running down the hallway until [they] reached the next patient, and many would not have thought twice about it. [But] There was something in her that made her different and at least on this occasion, the person she wanted herself to be shone through in unmanageable circumstances."

This young doctor understands that her profession demands of her an immediate and unconditional response to the needs of her patients — the same clear, unhesitating and total commitment that Jesus asks of anyone who would be his disciple. There can be no "but first . . . ", no "in a minute", no "on second thought." Jesus' Gospel is not a collection of pious words we commit to memory but a perspective and attitude by which we live our lives. We can't be disciples by being mere spectators of God's presence; possessing a baptismal certificate alone does not mark us as disciples of the Risen One. Authentic discipleship calls us to take on, with courage and commitment, the hard work of making the reign of God a reality regardless of the cost, regardless of the difficulty, regardless of the sacrifice.

Dear Members of Saint Barbara Parish and School,

For 155 years Saint Barbara School has instilled in students excellence directed to the growth of the whole person – mind, body and spirit. Saint Barbara School like the Church is not only a building or an institution, but it is the people. As the people of God, we work together to bring the Kingdom of God to Earth and rise up the next generation to do the same.

After careful study and prayerful discernment and in consultation with your pastor the Very Reverend Canon Maciej Mankowski, along with the Office of Catholic School of the Diocese of Youngstown, I have given permission to their request to close Saint Barbara School for the 2022-2023 school year. As communicated earlier in the Spring the plan was for both Saint Barbara and Saint Mary Schools to be open in the 2022-2023 school year, with one being closed the following year to support the parish reorganization. The decision to close the school now is a result of the overall demographic changes of the city, the school personnel changes that have occurred over the last years, along with only 61 students in grades K-8 and 9 students for pre-school registered for the 2022-2023 school year.

I know that as you read this letter you are sad for what you will be losing. But as the Catholic Community of Massillon we need to be proactive rather than reactive. Therefore, we need to create a solid and financially viable Catholic school by using the Saint Mary School building. Using one building will achieve a strong Catholic school presence in the City of Massillon. The aim of this combined effort is to provide high quality Catholic education that protects and fosters the importance of Catholic identity.

As the Catholic Church in Massillon we need to keep our focus on the needs of our students. This is our primary concern. Catholic education still matters. Catholic education has always been the heart of the of the Catholic Mission. Catholic education and the students, who are the product of it, have been called the greatest work of the Church.

I know that change is difficult. Nonetheless this is a positive change, indeed a necessary change. We always need to leave some old ways behind in order to improve and grow. Our lives are a series of small and not so small dying and risings. As a community we celebrate our successes and achievements. We share grief and downfalls. Let us unite together in solidarity, and even challenge each other to become better reflections that together "all may be one."

Dear School Parents, Students, and Parishioners,

It is with a heavy heart and sadness that I wish to inform you about the closing of St. Barbara Catholic School for the upcoming 2022-2023 academic year. It was my sincere hope while working in close cooperation with the Superintendent of Catholic School, Mrs. Mary Fiala that we would be able to pursue our original plan for the upcoming academic year by hiring one principal for both schools: St. Barbara and St. Mary and keeping both of them open until 2023.

Unfortunately, because of low enrollment for the next academic year at St. Barbara School reflected by 61 students in grades K-8 and only 9 students registered for the preschool, we realized that we needed to change the course of our action. In addition, with several teachers and staff members leaving St. Barbara School this year and a loss of some very generous alumni and parishioners who provided financial support for our school, it became obvious that we had no other option but to close St. Barbara School. I became extremely worried facing a possibility of accumulating a financial debt of over two hundred thousand dollars if the school was to remain open for the next academic year.

Please, know that you and your children as well as our remaining teachers will be welcomed with open arms at St. Mary School should they choose to make this transition. It is my sincere hope and prayer that having one strong and financially viable Catholic School in the city of Massillon will allow us to provide high quality education and preserve our Catholic identity for the future. You are cordially invited to attend an "open house" at St. Mary School on June 29, 2022, at 7:00 pm in the gym. You will meet our new principal Mrs. Lucia D. Huddleston, PhD, and some of the teachers.

Finally, I wish to thank each and everyone of you for your involvement and support of Catholic education. I have been touched and inspired by your sacrifices and conscientious efforts to foster and to promote Catholic education. We live in very difficult times reflected by high inflation and constantly rising prices of food, gasoline and many other things that are essential to our lives. The gift of Catholic education is the best gift anyone can give to their children, relatives, and friends. Catholic education is a key that will open many doors to those who benefit from it. Thank you for choosing Catholic education and for passing on the torch of faith, knowledge, and traditions to the future generations. You make a tremendous difference in the lives of others.
