



On September 9th we celebrate the feast of St. Peter Claver, and it provides us, as the lives of saints often do, with a chance not only for inspiration about what someone did in the past, but a challenge as to what we are called to do NOW!

Because of his exemplary and Christ-like service to the African slaves so horrendously brought to Cartagena, Columbia in the 17th century, St. Peter is rightly called the slave to the slaves. Google his life, and be ready for not only the absolute sinfulness he faced as human beings were degraded and treated as chattel in a terrible system of economic oppression, but also be absolutely inspired by what one can do if one cooperates with grace and acts always with compassion as a guiding light. Christ can work through human weakness and fear to bring about new life and hope even in the most impossible situations. St. Peter started out with basic human kindness, love, and compassion for all, regardless of race or origin or circumstance. He just did the job of Christians, the job that starts with compassion, but moves to justice, as St. Peter Claver was a challenge to the very systems that produced the horrors he encountered every day.

As we continue to struggle with injustice and racism, let us pray to St. Peter Claver that we not only do all things with love and compassion, but ask the tough questions of justice that need to be asked!

We need the saints more than ever, not only for the hope they offer that goodness always triumphs, but also for the fire they light in us to work for justice for all, that justice which leads to peace! Have a blessed week! Let's get to work!

They will be here after the 4:30 pm Mass on September 26th and between the 8:00 am and 10:30 am Masses on September 27th. We will be offering a 4-strain regular dose for those under 65 years old and a 4-strain high dose for everyone over 65 years old. Please bring ALL insurance cards. (We are unfortunately not contracted with stark county teachers and cannot bill for those vaccines.) If there is a copay after we bill your insurance, we will reach out to you to collect. If you do not have insurance, we will offer the vaccines at a cash price of \$39.00 for regular and \$75.00 for high dose. We will be accepting checks or exact change if paying cash. Questions?? 
